#### **FOOD WASTE**

Food waste facts and statistics

A third of all food produced globally is thrown away

The UK wastes approximately 9.52 million tonnes of food every year.

The average household spends £470 on food that ends up in the bin every year.

The UK produces the largest amount of food waste in Europe

We often have a roast on Sunday and I ALWAYS over-cater. Roast potatoes are frozen and used later in the week. They reheat beautifully. Meat is used in sandwiches.

On a Monday I put the leftover vegetables in a pan with some hot vegetable stock



Heat it for 5 mins. Then liquidise with a hand blender



Then I have soup for lunch. Less waste and a 'free' lunch

#### COLLECT

God, our refuge and strength, bring near the day when wars shall cease and poverty and pain shall end, that earth may know the peace of

heaven through Jesus Christ our Lord.

#### **FIRST READING** Jonah 3.1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, 'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.' So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now James son of Zebedee and his brother Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's and they left their father Zebedee in walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great **POST COMMUNION** and small, put on sackcloth.

When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

### **SECOND READING** Hebrews 9.24-end

For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Mark 1.14-20

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake—for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; the boat with the hired men, and followed him.
