#### **FOOD WASTE**

#### Food waste facts and statistics

A third of all food produced globally is thrown away

The UK wastes approximately 9.52 million tonnes of food every year. The average household spends £470 on food that ends up in the bin every year.

The UK produces the largest amount of food waste in Europe

'Most things can be frozen, so if you've got leftovers, or things approaching their use by date, whack them in the freezer. Don't forget to label them so you know how long they've been there.'



#### **FREEZING TIPS:**

Divide up bigger dishes so you can easily dig out a couple of portions at a time.

Grate hard cheese before it is frozen and give defrosted skimmed milk a good shake before using it.

Eggs cope well in the freezer with a bit of prep. Beat until blended, pour them into freezer containers and label the containers with how many eggs are in each before

#### **FIRST READING Jeremiah 33:14-16**

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfil the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The Lord is our righteousness.'

#### 1 Thessalonians 3:9-End

#### **GOSPEL** Luke 21:25-36

'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

O Lord our God, make us watchful and keep us faithful as we await the coming of your Son that, when he shall appear, he may not find us sleeping in sin but active in his service and joyful in his praise; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
